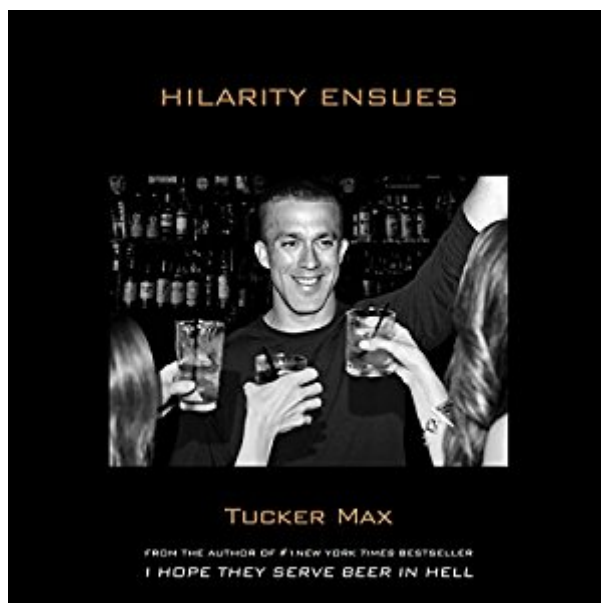


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# Hilarity Ensues

I am not the target audience for this genre but I received the first book "I Hope they Serve Beer in

Tucker Max is a clever writer and definitely knows how to tell a story (albeit embellished in the afterglow of alcohol and hindsight humor). It is wicked funny. I always wanted to know how my bachelor brother spent his premarital years without actually having to have a front row seat, and this is a fair approximation. I got hooked on the characters (looking at you, Slingblade) and this book brought all the story lines to a fitting climax (no pun intended).

Nice to hear a narcissist talk so openly about how desperate women are. I admire Tuckers incredible physical constitution. If only Phillip S. Hoffman had it and so many other addicts. The most interesting part of the book is Tucker trying not to be such a narcissist and change. All narcissists can change- if they want to.
