

Gr. 4-6. From Cobblestone's The Civil War series, this book discusses the battle of Antietam. Based on articles that appeared in Cobblestone, Appleseeds, and Dig magazines, the short chapters explore topics such as the one-day battle itself, the armies' artillery, Clara Barton, and the mascot dogs present at Antietam. The writing is clear and accessible, and the pages are attractively designed, with colorful sidebars introducing key figures and additional information, such as two

observers' accounts of the battle. Illustrations include many period photos as well as a small map of the battlefield. A map showing all Civil War battlefields and a time line of the war appear in each series volume. Unfortunately, the last page of the book carries a full-color ad for the series, complete with a highlighted special offer. Unlike the ads that appear in the American Girls series, this one cannot easily be removed as it is bound into the book, and, in fact, the book's index is located on the other side of the page.
