

I read a bit of the book already, and well get back to this review when completed.

Charlotte Gray, one of CanadaÃ¢Â¢Â¢s best known writers of non-fiction, has produced another gem. The Promise of Canada: 150 years of People and Ideas that have shaped our Country is the one volume I would hope most Canadians read this year. Beginning with George-Etienne Cartier and finishing up with Preston Manning she provides insights into the soul of our country. Three particular chapters stood out for me. Her writing about Emily Carr and her art was entrancing. Most commentary on art is vapid gibberish. Hers is insightful, probing, thoughtful and prosaic. Similarly

her writing about Justice Bertha Wilson brings to life a truly remarkable woman who forged a trail in law that broke many a glass ceiling. The chapter on Elijah Harper provides the best explanation of the case aborigines have for a fundamental reform from how we have treated them the past. If I had to pick one book to give this Christmas this is it.

Really interesting view of pivotal moments in Canada's history. Greatly appreciate the authors willingness to dig deep rather than fill the book with the usual suspects. All the chapters involve names and topics you "kind of" know...but give insight into who, what and how.
