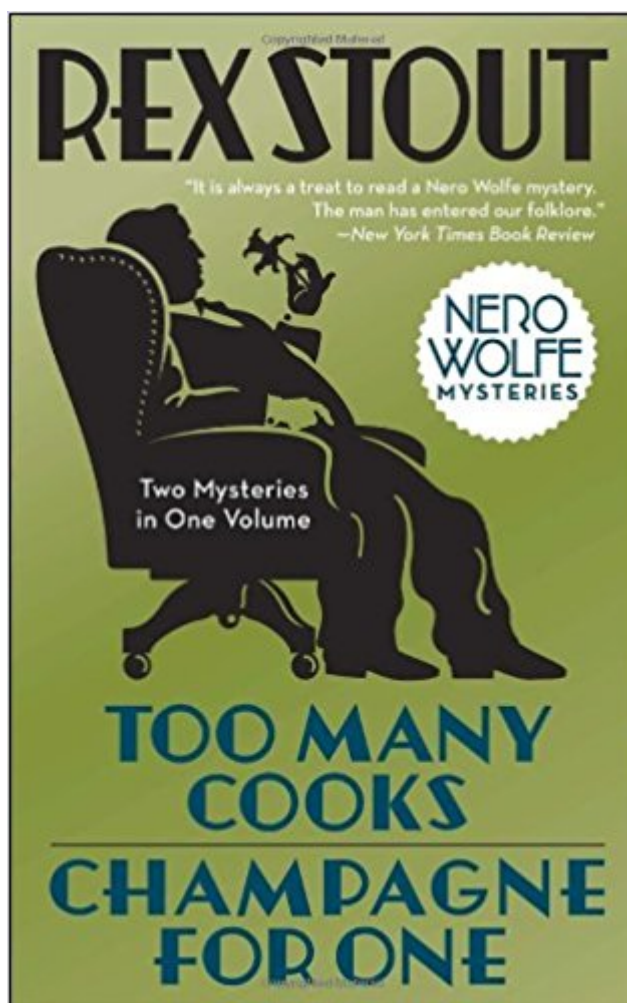

As always with Rex Stout, brilliantly written, great plot and characters, and a surprise solution. This book is special in that it offers a unique insight into Archie Goodwin, Nero Wolfe's self-described confidential assistant-gofer-leg man-and, as needed, cattle prod. The murder, at a high-class charity soiree, takes place literally in front of Archie and he takes it very personally. His thoughts and comments on the subject are, by themselves, well worth reading this book. But don't limit yourself to just this segment. The entire book delivers the gamut of emotions and challenges your thought processes all the way to the final solution.

Archie gets Nero Wolfe to actually leave his beloved brownstone to attend a gathering of foodies and various female family members. No sooner has the train left the station than the accusations of skull duggery start, big knives disappear, and the females start making trouble. One of the knives is found in one of the chefs, and pressure is on Wolfe to solve it. Second book is a baby mama who wants-death? Surely not, and Archie brings in the suspects only to have the case turned on its head - twisty mystery with a twisty ending; 2 good mysteries!

Too Many Cooks is set in a spa for the wealthy, more common in 1940 than in 2014. Wolfe is away from home as the guest of a group of "grand master" chefs. Food is especially prominent in this case, as is the issue of race relations. Stout, through Wolfe, expresses opinions that were very liberal, for that era. The fledgling air travel business is also critical to the crime. Champagne for One contrasts classes - elite vs. working. The solution to the central event of suicide which is really

murder, is somewhat contrived, and not totally convincing, but Wolfe fans will have no trouble with it. Archie has a peripheral role in Too Many Cooks, but is central to the action of Champagne for One. The writing is smooth and tight in both books.

Nero Wolfe and Archie Goodwin, as Walter Mosley says, "Holmes meets Spade.

Simply wonderful. These two books are among my favorites. And if you are a big Nero Wolfe fan check out 's video offerings.

Too Many Cooks/Champagne for One is a great buy supplying lots of old fashioned detective enjoyment in the 1930's genre. Nero Wolfe & his sidekick Archie Goodwin are a pair worth reading about as they have an amazing professional relationship in the New York City of yesteryear. In these two related pieces they travel to a country resort setting for Nero Wolfe's professional honor, solve a mystery & return to NYC for more professional hijinks.
