This is all I had hoped for: years ago, I bought the original scarf style, and used it to advance my knitting skills. It's still a go-to treasure. This new volume has more voluminous and extravagantly

lovely scarves than the original; no more one-skein quickies, at least at first glance. Even so, I want to make them all. A real win.

I love the scarfs that you find in this book. They are unique and I adore the various patterns. Unfortunately, I found it very difficult to follow the pattern. I purchased this book primarily for the "Cottage Scarf" located on page 27. I think that if you are taking a knitting class and have someone with experience looking over your shoulder to help you along then you should be fine. If you're a beginner trying to teach yourself how to knit then I would recommend trying something other than this book. I have been searching for a pattern in this book that I can try but I haven't found it yet. I will however be holding onto this book for down the road when I acquire more skills. It'll give me something to look forward to!! Just to clarify my skills right now to use as a guide for what I consider a beginner. I have knit several scarfs containing the following stitches; Ribbing, St st, Pearling and basic cables. I've also completed a simple summer tank top in a St st with I-Cord shoulder straps. If you're more advanced then I think this book will provide you with several lovely projects.

I waited for this one...the patterns were right up my alley. But I am a picky book lover and this one arrived with a torn cover, ripped pages and crumpled binding. It was tossed in the box with a bunch of heavier items. Very poorly packed by , but it WAS during the Christmas rush time, and I should have known better than to order a book in an order with cans of tomatoes! I love the patterns, Ann Budd is one of my favorite pattern writers - and she never disappoints. If you order this book - make sure to order it by itself. It is not plastic wrapped by the publisher and can be damaged by 's shipping practices.

I was hoping for more actual scarves. This book has triangle shawls, wraps, cowls, and eternity scarves knit in the round. Rectangular scarves? Very few. The patterns for the most part are neither quick nor easy. The majority I would classify as advanced/intermediate to advanced. Sadly, I can't knit most of the patterns and truthfully, I don't like them enough to ask for help with them. The title is very misleading too. There are tons of books out now featuring just cowls. Or shawls. I was hoping the majority would be open ended scarves.

This book is full of beautiful patterns for scarves and cowls. Can't wait to get knitting on some of these.

The designs in this book are really nice. At first, I thought that it would be difficult to knit from the charts by reading them within the Kindle app. I really appreciate the fact that Interweave provides a download link for the charts and the chart legend. This made it possible to print the chart to cross off the rows, or to view the chart in the Goodreader app so that I could annotate the page as I knit.

Invariably I buy a book of patterns because one catches my eye and then find that they are not ALL winners, but that is life. Actually, this book has four or five patterns that I would like to make and one that I actually have! The patterns are complete and easy to follow and that is what I am looking for.

Beautiful but difficult patterns. The patterns need more diagrams and explanation. They are very beautiful and unusual, but for the average knitter, the author needs to include step by step diagrams/illustrations instead of just the patterns.

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
