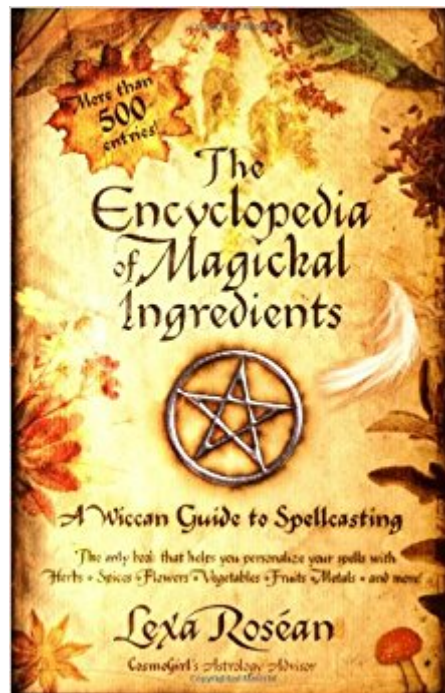

While much of the information is reasonably accurate, sources are not cited and no information is

given for why certain things are included. Such gems of inaccuracy include "Star Anise" saying "See Anise" and "Anise" giving instructions for using licorice whips. Additionally, much of the book is love spells. Love spells such as slathering bacon grease on yourself to relieve adultery. Skip it.

Although this book does have several examples of ingredients it falls regrettably short of the vast variety that can be used in the more ancient potions. It also neglects to go into any great detail about preparation and collection about several of the ingredients.

There's a lot of information packed inside, most of it is brief and not in depth, but more than enough to get your creative juices flowing. If you already own several reference books, (e.g. The Complete Book of Incense, Oils and Brews and the Encyclopedia of Crystal, Gem & Metal Magic, both by Scott Cunningham) you will find little new information here. If, however, you are new to the Craft and/or you don't already have a magickal encyclopedia, this one book will cover pretty much all your needs.

This book is really helpful, however as a beginner I would have really liked it to have had pictures to help learn to identify the plants and herbs discussed. If you're like me you may want to buy a field guide or botanical encyclopedia to accompany this book.
