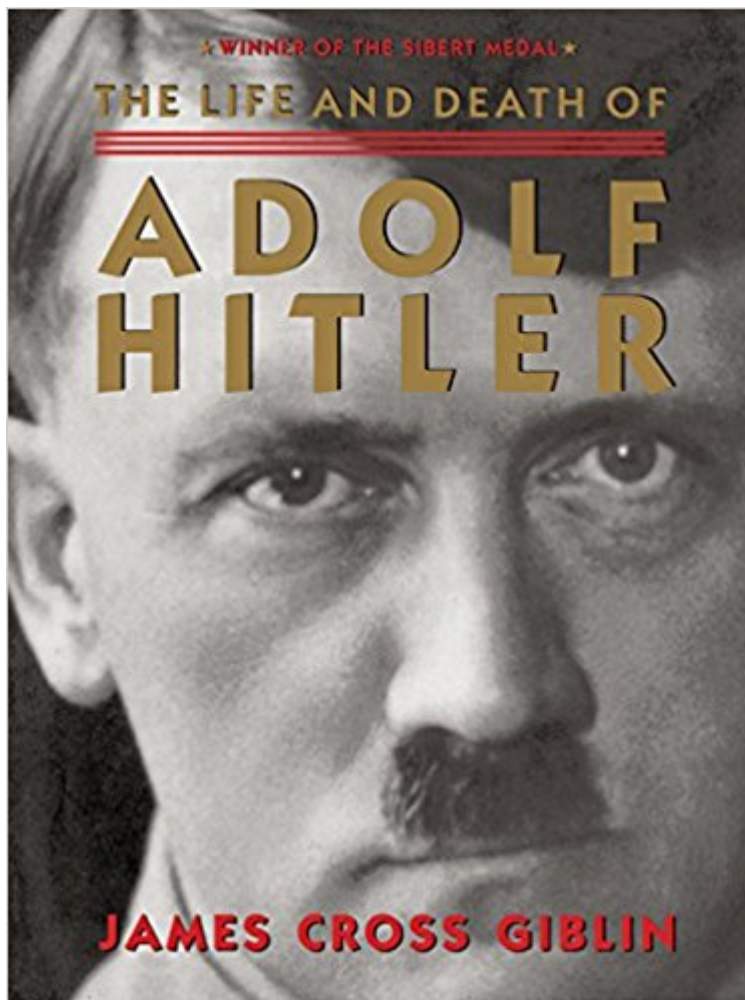

James Cross Giblin (1933-2016) was the author of more than twenty critically acclaimed books for young people. His book *The Life and Death of Adolf Hitler* received the Robert F. Sibert Award for Informational Books.

There are so many biographies about Hitler out there for young readers, but this is by far the best. Giblin is a master at using primary sources (photos, letters, etc) to document Hitler's youth, rise to power, and his goals. Overall, the message is that Hitler wasn't this anomalous monster, but he was a man. A demagogue who gave the people what they wanted, and then pushed them all over the brink. He did monstrous things, he was terrible, he was the worst, but Giblin gives insight into why and how he achieved the things he did. Kids are fascinated by Hitler, and I understand why. Giving them Giblin's book is the most responsible way to help them satisfy that thirst. He dispels the rumors and lies about Hitler's life, and leaves us with an understanding greater than you'd expect for a middle grades book.
